## Protect Voter Choice!

## Vote NO on Prop 14

Even if no one running represents your view, you can write in the name of someone who does.

The ballot is the way YOU tell the politicians what YOU want.

Third-party and independent candidates bring new ideas to the public policy debate.

Prop 14 eliminates the write in vote.

Prop 14 removes your choices in November and your ability to tell the politicians that you want change.

Prop 14 is designed to keep these candidates off the November ballot and eliminate third parties.

Free elections require maximum voter participation.

Prop 14 only allows voters full choices in the June primary, when less than half the voters show up.

Prop 14 makes it harder to fire failed incumbents.

Legislators who fail to solve our problems need to be replaced.

Just look at Washington state, which recently implemented Top Two.  
Out of 123 legislative races, only **one** incumbent lost in the primary.

If you live in a heavily Democratic district, your ballot could look like this:

Even Republican and Democratic voters can be disenfranchised by Top Two.

If you live in a more Republican district, your ballot could look like this:
